
WHY WOMEN'S STUDIES?



THE MAJOR

There are three tracks in the Women's Studies major: Theories and Politics of Sexualities, International Perspectives on Gender, and the General Concentration. The General Concentration draws on the insights of many different fields—history, sociology, literature, and political science, to name just a few—to explore questions of gender, sexuality, and power in the U.S. and abroad, from antiquity to present.

The WMS major requires 30 credits. **Fifteen** credits may "double-count," meaning they also count toward your major in another department.

There is no set progression of coursework, but all majors in the General Concentration must take the following 3-credit core courses:

WST 3015 Interdisciplinary Perspectives in Women's Studies

WST 3415 Transnational Feminism

WST 4935 Capstone Seminar in Women's Studies

WST 4940 Internship <u>OR</u> a gender and sciencefocused class approved by the major

THE MINOR

The Women's Studies minor requires 18 credits, including the core course WST 3015, Interdisciplinary Perspectives in Women's Studies.

The remaining 15 credit hours must be taken from Women's Studies approved electives (which may or may not have a WST prefix) designated on the website each semester. Nine credits may count toward both the minor and a major in another program.
